6. SETTLE CLAIM / MICHAEL HAGOPIAN AND AMY HAGOPIAN V. TOWN OF ORANGETOWN

WHEREAS, on or about March 8, 2021 an accident occurred whereby Claimants Michael K. Hagopian and Amy Hagopian claimed that a Town of Orangetown ("Town") Highway Department vehicle struck Claimant's vehicle resulting in property damage; and

WHEREAS, on or about March 16, 2021, the Town has received and been served with a Notice of Claim from Michael K. Hagopian and Amy Hagopian, for the cost of vehicle repair and rental car services as damages.

WHEREAS, the Town investigated this claim and obtained a condition report concerning the condition of the damaged vehicle and the repairs performed, and

WHEREAS, the Town has agreed to pay, subject to Town Board approval, the amount of \$11,000.00 as full and final settlement of the damages asserted in the Notice of Claim,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the claim by Michael K. Hagopian and Amy Hagopian shall be settled and paid by the Town in the full and final amount of \$11,000.00, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Supervisor or her designee is authorized to execute any and all legal documents in order to effectuate the enforcement of this resolution.

7. ELIZABETH STREET, PEARL RIVER / INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT / LETTER OF INTENT

WHEREAS, Hegarty Homes, Inc., through its attorney Donald Brenner, Esq., requests the Town Board provide a letter of intent relating to entering into an intermunicipal agreement between the Town and the Borough of Montvale; and

WHEREAS, Hegarty Homes, Inc., developed a parcel of land in the Town of Orangetown, (Kennedy Parcel – Harmony Hill), located on Elizabeth Street, in Pearl River bordering the New Jersey State line, and a portion of such property is located in the Borough of Montvale, Bergen County, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, access to the New Jersey portion of the land is only through the Town of Orangetown; and

WHEREAS, Hegarty Homes, Inc. has appeared before the Planning Board of the Borough of Montvale, which agreed to review the subdivision design but requested a letter indicating that the subdivision in New Jersey would obtain services from the Town of Orangetown; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Brenner has prepared a draft of a proposed interlocal agreement pursuant to New York State General Municipal Law Section 462; and

WHEREAS, the Town Attorney's Office has prepared a draft of a proposed letter of intent; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Brenner's draft of a proposed interlocal agreement and the Town Attorney's draft of a proposed letter of intent have been circulated to the Highway Department, the Department of Environmental Management and Engineering, the Police Department, and the Building Department; and

WHEREAS, said departments have no objection to the Town entering into a reasonable interlocal agreement with the Borough of Montvale in this regard or with the Town Board authorizing signature of the proposed letter of intent.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town agrees to enter into an interlocal agreement with the Borough of Montvale relating to providing services for the New Jersey portion of the property located on Elizabeth Street, Pearl River, New York and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Supervisor is hereby authorized to sign the proposed letter of intent as drafted by the Town Attorney's Office.
