RESOLUTION NO. 447

ADOPT LOCAL LAW NO. 9 OF 2021 / AMENDING TOWN ZONING MAP / 100 CORPORATE DRIVE BLAUVELT/ FROM LI AND LIO ZONING DISTRICTS TO LI ZONING DISTRICT IN ITS ENTIRETY

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Orangetown (the "Town Board") is the duly elected legislative body of the Town, authorized to adopt zoning text amendments to the Town's Zoning Law; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has considered the adoption of an amendment to Chapter 43, § 2.2 to change the zoning district of the entire parcel known as 100 Corporate Drive in the hamlet of Blauvelt, tax lot 65.18/1/16 being located in both the "LI" (Light Industrial) and "LIO" (Light Industrial-Office) zoning districts, to change the zoning classification of the entire property to that of "LI" (Light Industrial),

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 446 of 2021, after notice duly given, and there being no other involved agency, by resolution duly adopted this 9th day of November, 2021, the Town Board assumed the role of Lead Agency under SEQRA for environmental review, and, acting in its capacity as such, concluded that there will be no significant environmental impact or effect caused or occasioned by the proposed change in the Town's Zoning Law and determines the issuance of Negative Declaration is appropriate; and

WHEREAS, following due notice, a public hearing was conducted on the proposed zone change amendment; and

WHEREAS, the Board has concluded that the proposed zone change which simply changes the zoning classification of the subject parcel, which his already partially developed in accordance with the "LI" zoning district zoning district, is consistent with the Town's Master Plan and route 3030 Overlay Zone, and otherwise is in the best interests of the Town and the owner of the parcel, who has requested the change of zoning classification; and

WHEREAS, the Town Planning Board, pursuant to Town Code Chapter 43, § 10.5, and the County Planning Department, pursuant to General Municipal Law §§ 2391 & m, have each reviewed the proposed law; and

WHEREAS, the Town Planning Board, by Memorandum, dated 10/27/2021, following due consideration at a public meeting held on the same date, has offered no comment; and

WHEREAS, the County Department of Planning, by letter review dated November 4, 2021, has recommended modifications as set forth therein. To the extent any comments are not considered addressed, for the reasons set forth below and to the extent necessary, the Board hereby overrides the comments for the reasons set forth below:

LOCAL LAW NO. <u>9</u> OF 2021 AMENDING CHAPTER 43 ARTICLE II OF THE TOWN CODE ENTITLED "ZONING MAP"

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF ORANGETOWN AS FOLLOWS:

Chapter 43, Article II, §2.2 entitled Zoning Map

The said section of the Code is amended as follows:

Section 1: The Zoning Map of the Town of Orangetown, which establishes the areas and boundaries of the various Town zoning districts, is hereby amended to change the zoning district of the following property:

100 Corporate Drive, Bluavelt, New York (Tax Map Designation Section 65.18 Block 1 Lot 16) from the "LIO" (Light Industrial) and "LIO" (Light Industrial) Confice) zoning districts to the "LI" (Light Industrial) zoning district in its entirety, which metes and bounds description is as follows:

All that certain lot, piece or parcel of land, situate, lying and being in the Town of Orangeburg, County of Rockland and State of New York and being more accurately bounded and described as follows:

BEGINNING AT A POINT IN THE WESTERLY LINE OF NEW YORK STATE ROUTE 303 (ALSO KNOWN AS VRIESENDAEL ROAD – 80 FEET WIDE PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY), SAID POINT BEING THE BEGINNING POINT OF SECTION 65.18, BLOCK 1, LOT 16 AS DESCRIBED IN INSTRUMENT NUMBER 2019-00013022, AND RUNNING THENCE THE FOLLOWING TWO (2) COURSES ALONG SAID LINE OF NEW YORK STATE ROUTE 303;

- 1. ALONG SAID WESTERLY LINE, SOUTH 25 DEGREES 18 MINUTES 35 SECONDS WEST, A DISTANCE OF 28.44 FEET TO A POINT, THENCE;
- 2. ALONG SAME, ON A CURVE THE LEFT, HAVING A RADIUS OF 1903.04 FEET, A CENTRAL ANGLE OF 17 DEGREES 31 MINUTES 18 SECONDS, AN ARC LENGTH OF 581.97 FEET, A CHORD BEARING OF SOUTH 16 DEGREES

32 MINUTES 56 SECONDS EAST, AND A CHORD DISTANCE OF 579.70 FEET TO A POINT IN SAID LINE OF ROUTE 303, WHERE IT IS INTERSECTED BY THE SOUTHERLY LINE OF BLOCK 1, LOT 16, THENCE;

3. ALONG SAID SOUTHERLY LINE, NORTH 80 DEGREES 35 MINUTES 57 SECONDS WEST, A DISTANCE OF 183.70 FEET TO A POINT IN THE EXISTING BOUNDARY LINE BETWEEN ZONE LI AND ZONE LIO, THENCE;

ACROSS BLOCK 1, LOT 16 ALONG SAID EXISTING ZONE BOUNDARY LINE THE FOLLOWING TWO (2) COURSES;

- 4. NORTH 12 DEGREES 51 MINUTES 21 SECONDS EAST, A DISTANCE OF 347.08 FEET TO A POINT, THENCE;
- 5. NORTH 23 DEGREES 18 MINUTES 46 SECONDS EAST, A DISTANCE OF 363.20 FEET TO A POINT IN THE NORTHERLY LINE OF AN ACCESS EASEMENT RECORDED IN INSTRUMENT 2020-00037930, THENCE;
