3. CIRCULATE PETITION / SEQRA/GML REVIEW AMENDMENT / PROPOSED LOCAL LAW / RE-SCHEDULE PUBLIC HEARING

WHEREAS, pursuant to Town Board Resolution 2021-_____ the Town Board accepted the petition of the owner of premises located at 68 Sickletown Road, Orangeburg, New York, (Tax lot 69.19/1/6), the Van Houten Farm Market Benefit Trust (Petitioner), which petition requested the Town Board to amend the Town Code to permit "agricultural activities and agri-tourism" in an R-80 and R-40 zoning district, and provide for definitions thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board scheduled a public hearing on the proposal for December 14, 2021, and

WHEREAS, by letter dated November 30, 2021, the Petitioner has since revised its petition to request the Town Code be amended to make "agricultural activities and agritourism" uses in an R-80 and R-40 zoning district by special permit, and

WHEREAS, upon preliminary review, the Town Board hereby accepts the petition as revised and wishes to proceed with its consideration of the proposed action, toward which end it wishes to commence the environmental review process, as well as review by other interested agencies; and

WHEREAS, upon review of the Petition as revised, and Part One of a Full Environmental Assessment Form prepared by the petitioner, and related documents and filings, the Board makes the following preliminary determinations:

- 1. The proposed action is one subject to review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA");
- 2. The proposed action as an "Unlisted" action; and
- 3. The following are involved or interested or involved agencies in the review process:
 - Town of Orangetown Planning Board;
 - Rockland County Department of Planning;
 - Rockland County Highway Department

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby declares its intention to serve as Lead Agency for the purpose of environmental review under SEQRA, and directs that a Lead Agency Coordination Letter with relevant documents be circulated to and among the various above referenced agencies; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the circulation to the Rockland County Department of Planning further be for the purpose of review pursuant to General Municipal Law §§ 239-1 & m; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that, pursuant to Town Code Chapter 43, § 10.5, the Town Board hereby refers the said Petition as revised and a proposed Local Law, amending the Town Zoning Map, to the Town Planning Board, inviting its input regarding, among other things, the implications of such an amendment, and requesting

a response within 30-days and pursuant to §10.51A shall retain the services of a professional planner to provide a report and recommendations on the proposal, the fees for which shall be reimbursed by the applicant, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Public Hearing on the petition by Van Houten Farm Market Benefit Trust, the owner of property located at 68 Sickletown Road, Orangeburg, New York (Tax Lot 69.19/1/6), as since revised, for consideration of a proposed Local Law, amending Chapter 43, Article XI, Definition and Word Usage, by inserting definitions of "agricultural operations" and "agri- tourism", and Article III, Use and Bulk Tables for R-80 (and as applied to R -40), column 6 Uses by Special Permit, to authorize agricultural and agri-tourism as a use by Special Permit, and column 6, minimum required off street parking for agricultural and agri-tourism, that was scheduled for December 14, 2021 at 7:05 pm. is hereby re-scheduled to Tuesday February 1, 2022 at 7:05 p.m.

5. AMEND RESOLUTION 2020-19 TO AUTHORIZE SUPERVISOR TO SIGN GRANT AGREEMENT WITH EFC FOR TELEMETRY UPGRADES TO THE ORANGETOWN WWTP

WHEREAS, pursuant to Town Board Resolution 2020-19 the Town Board confirmed its acceptances of a NYS Water Infrastructure Improvement Grant (WIIA) from the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC), identified as project No. C3-5345-09-00 "Telemetry Upgrades to the Orangetown WWTP" and

WHEREAS, the previous resolution authorized the Supervisor to sign the Grant Agreement no later than June 25, 2021 and

WHEREAS, NYS EFC sent the Grant Agreement for review and signature of the Town Supervisor in November, 2021,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that resolution 2020-19 is hereby amended to the extent that the Supervisor or her designee is authorized to enter into and sign the Grant Agreement for the WIIA Grant on behalf of the Town before December 31, 2021.

6. AUTHORIZE SUPERVISOR TO SIGN ENGAGEMENT LETTER FROM O'CONNOR DAVIES/ ACCOUNTING SERVICES FOR THE TOWN / CY 2021 IS \$109,900.00 PER YEAR AND CY 2022 IS \$102,900.00 PER YEAR

RESOLVED, upon the recommendation of the Finance Director, the Town of Orangetown Board authorizes the Supervisor to sign a contract with O'Connor Davies to perform auditing services for the Town for CY 2021 and CY 2022. The cost of services is a 2% increase per year. In 2021, the cost is \$100,900 and in 2022 the cost is \$102,900.

7. RETAIN LABERGE GROUP / HYBRID ZONING SOUTH NYACK

WHEREAS, pursuant to NY General Municipal Law (GML) Article 17-A, the Village of South Nyack will be dissolved as of March 31, 2022, and

WHEREAS, according to NY GML §789, all laws of the former Village continue in effect for a period of up to two years after dissolution, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board finds it is in the interests of the Town to review the current Village of South Nyack Code in order to incorporate appropriate zoning and other provisions into the Town of Orangetown Code, which will be the Code that applies to the area that comprised the former Village, and

WHEREAS, LaBerge Group, Albany, New York, has submitted a proposal to assist the Town in review of current codes and drafting appropriate amendments to the Town Code,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board hereby authorizes the retention of the Laberge Group for purposes of providing professional planning services in accordance with the attached proposal, at the pro-rated cost of \$24,250.00, and that the Supervisor or her designee is authorized to execute any documents necessary to effectuate the purposes of this resolution, upon review and approval of the Town Attorney's Office.

8. AUTHORIZE INTERMUNICIPAL AGREEMENT / VILLAGE OF SOUTH NYACK / HIGHWAY SERVICES / PURCHASE OF EQUIPMENT

WHEREAS, the voters of the Village of South Nyack elected to dissolve the Village and the Village Board of the Village of South Nyack has adopted a plan for dissolution effective March 31, 2022 pursuant to General Municipal Law Article 17-A; and

WHEREAS, GML Article 5-G specifically authorizes and encourages municipal corporations to enter into agreements with each other in order to provide, cooperatively, jointly or by contract or agreement, any facility, service, activity or undertaking, which each participating municipal corporation has the power to provide separately; and

WHEREAS, the Village of South Nyack has requested that the Town of Orangetown provide highway maintenance and building and grounds related services to the Village, such as snow and ice control measures on Village streets, and services similar to those services currently performed by the Village Department of Public Works, commencing on January 1, 2022 through and including March 31, 2022 until such time as the Village dissolves, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Orangetown, in anticipation of ultimately providing such services to the area that comprised the dissolved Village as of April 1, 2022, and in consideration of the payment of the sum of \$82,751.00, is willing to provide such services subject to a formal written agreement between the Town and the Village and

WHEREAS, the Village of South Nyack has certain equipment from its Department of Public Works (see list annexed hereto) that it is selling as part of the dissolution process and the Town is desirous of purchasing same for the purpose of using same as part of its operation in providing highway related services to the Village under the proposed IMA, as well as the area comprising the former Village as of April 1, 2022, and

WHEREAS, the Town and Village have agreed that the amount to be paid by the Town to the Village for the subject equipment totals \$374,800.00 and the Town has agreed to pay same,

NOW THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that the Town Board authorizes the Town Supervisor to execute an Intermunicipal Agreement between the Town of Orangetown and the Village of South Nyack, subject to review and approval of the Town Attorney, whereby the Town of Orangetown agrees to provide highway maintenance and building and grounds services, including snow and ice control measures to the Village of South Nyack, commencing at midnight, January 1, 2022, for the sum of \$82,751.00, to be paid on or before January 1, 2022 and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Board authorizes the purchase certain equipment from the Village of South Nyack that it is selling as part of its dissolution plan and which it is in the best interests of the Town to purchase such equipment, as set forth in the subject Intermunicipal Agreement, for the sum of \$374,800.00 and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Supervisor or her designee is authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the terms of this resolution.

9. WAIVE 30-DAY ADVANCE NOTICE / ON-PREMISES ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE LICENSE / UNKNOWN22 CORP.

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby waives the 30-day advance notice to the Town of Orangetown for the on-premises alcoholic beverage license for Unknown22 Corp. d/b/a The Unknown Restaurant and Bar.

10. EXTEND AUTHORIZATION FOR OUTDOOR DINING / SIDEWALK CAFES / EXTEND RESOLUTION 2020-249; 2020-539; 2021-243

WHEREAS on June 2, 2020 pursuant to Town Board Resolution 2020-249, the Town Board, in response to the economic recovery as a result of the COVID-19 crisis and pursuant to the authority prescribed in Chapter 6-5(F) of the Orangetown Code, authorized the Director of OBZPAE to waive, modify, and adjust certain requirements of Chapter 31B regarding Sidewalk Cafes and Vending, and to suspend enforcement of the zoning regulations and requirements or land use restrictions to obtain an Outdoor Dining Permit, and to maintain required off-street parking for outdoor dining, at a lawful restaurant and food service establishment, and to issue a Temporary Outdoor Dining Permit and

WHEREAS, on December 15, 2020 pursuant to Town Board Resolution 2020-539, the Town Board extended the temporary suspension of Section 31B of the Town Code and authorized the Director of OBZPAE to issue Temporary Outdoor Dining permits through and including December 31, 2021, subject to the same terms and conditions of Town Board Resolution 2020-249, and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 crisis and the economic recovery therefrom continues to impact the residents and businesses of the Town of Orangetown and the authorization for outdoor dining and sidewalk cafes have provided relief to the businesses in the Town of Orangetown will providing patrons an opportunity to socialize in a safe setting in accordance with the Governor's guidelines for operations of dining facilities during the COVID-19 crisis,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board hereby extends the temporary suspension of Section 31B as set forth in Town Board Resolution 2020-249, 2020-539, and 2021-243 and authorization to the Director of OBZPAE to issue Temporary Outdoor Dining Permits through and including December 31, 2022, subject to all of the terms and conditions as set forth in Resolution 2020-249, 2020-539 and 2021-243, regardless of previous or future capacity restricitions imposed by the State of New York.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that notwithstanding the foregoing, the combined occupancy of the indoor and outdoor dining for businesses operating under the Temporary Dining Permit, shall not exceed the occupancy limits for the premises related to life safety issues such as fire safety matters and sanitary facilities. Any violation of the terms of the Temporary Outdoor Dining permit as set forth herein shall subject the holder of such Permit to revocation as provided in Resolution 2020-249 and Section 6-5(F) of the Town Code.

WHEREAS, the Town Board, in consultation Chief of Police, has determined that it is in the best interests of the Town Orangetown to continue to participate with the County of Rockland in this program and assign a Detective to the Rockland County Drug Task Force, for which the Town will be reimbursed the sum of \$30,000.00 from the County pursuant to written agreement; and

WHEREAS, General Municipal Law Article 5-G expressly authorizes municipal governments to perform together that which each such government individually is authorized to perform by means of an inter-municipal agreement,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby approves a certain Intermunicipal Agreement ("IMA") by and between the County of Rockland and the Town of Orangetown, which IMA was previously approved by Resolution 478 of 2021 of the Rockland County Legislature, pursuant to which the Town agrees to assign a Detective to the Rockland County Drug Task Force and for which the Town will be reimbursed the sum of \$30,000.00, for the time period of January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2023,; and

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Supervisor or her designee is hereby authorized to sign such IMA and to take further steps as may be necessary to effectuate its terms.
