5. SEQRA / LEAD AGENCY / TYPE II ACTION / NEGATIVE SEQRA DECLARATION / RENEWAL OF CABLEVISION FRANCHISE

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby declares itself to be Lead Agency for environmental review with respect to the matter of extending the Cablevision Franchise agreement; and further determines that such action is a Type II action pursuant to SEQRA, that the action will not have a significant adverse environmental impact, and, therefore, no further action is necessary with respect thereto under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

6. APPROVE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT / CABLEVISION OF ROCKLAND/RAMAPO LLC / 15 YEAR RENEWAL

WHEREAS, the Town of Orangetown (the "Town") is a "franchising authority" in accordance with Title VI of the Communications Act of 1934, (the "Communications Act"), and is authorized to grant one or more nonexclusive cable television franchises pursuant to Article 11 of the New York Public Service Law, as amended, and Title 16, Chapter VIII, Parts 890.60 through 899, of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, as amended (collectively the "Cable Laws"); and

WHEREAS, the Town, executed a franchise agreement with Cablevision of Rockland/Ramapo, LLC (the "Franchisee") on November 24, 2008, which was thereafter confirmed and made effective by the New York State Public Service Commission ("Commission") on November 5, 2009 for a term of fifteen (15) years (Case No. 09-V-0369), and

WHEREAS, said franchise agreement expires on November 5, 2024; and

WHEREAS, Franchisee has submitted a proposed franchise renewal agreement (the "Franchise Renewal Agreement") to continue operating its system within the Town for an additional 15 year period; and

WHEREAS, The Town and Franchisee have mutually agreed to the terms of said Franchise Renewal Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Town has determined that the Franchisee is and has been in substantial compliance with all terms/provisions of its existing franchises and applicable law; and

WHEREAS, the Town has determined that Franchisee has the requisite legal, technical and financial capabilities to operate a Cable Systems within the Town and that Franchisee's proposals for renewal of the franchises meet the cable related needs of the Community; and

WHEREAS, a duly noticed Public Hearing, affording an opportunity for all those interested parties within the Town to be heard on the proposed Franchise Renewal Agreement was held before the Town Board on June 11, 2024.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board determines that it is in the best interest of the public to award the Franchise Renewal Agreement to the Franchisee; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Board hereby authorizes the Town Supervisor to enter into the Franchise Renewal Agreement with Cablevision of Rockland/Ramapo, LLC, and to execute any other documents necessary to effectuate the granting of the franchise renewal on behalf of the Town of Orangetown.

17. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE COUNTY OF ROCKLAND, RELATING TO THE REGIONAL INVESTIGATIVE RESOURCE CENTER

WHEREAS, the County of Rockland, through the Office of the Rockland County District Attorney, is desirous of entering into agreements with local municipal police departments to form a regional investigative resource center to create a "shared services" environment to effectively and efficiently utilize all resources to secure justice and public safety in the 21st Century; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board, in consultation Chief of Police, has determined that it is in the best interests of the Town Orangetown to continue to participate with the County of Rockland and other local police departments in this important venture; and

WHEREAS, General Municipal Law Article 5-G expressly authorizes municipal governments to perform together that which each such government individually is authorized to perform by means of an inter-municipal agreement,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby approves a certain Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") by and between the County of Rockland and the Town of Orangetown, which MOU was previously approved by Resolution 258 of 2024 of the Rockland County Legislature, pursuant to which the Town agrees to participate in the Regional Investigative Resource Center (RIRC) in accordance with the terms of the said MOU, for the period January 1, 2024 thru December 31, 2024; and

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Supervisor is hereby authorized to sign such MOU and to take further steps as may be necessary to effectuate its terms.
