6. AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF ORANGETOWN TO RENEW A CABLE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT WITH VERIZON NEW YORK, INC. TO OPERATE A CABLE SYSTEM IN THE TOWN OF ORANGETOWN

WHEREAS, the Town of Orangetown (the "Town") is a "franchising authority" in accordance with Title VI of the Communications Act of 1934, (the "Communications Act"), and is authorized to grant one or more nonexclusive cable television franchises pursuant to Article 11 of the New York Public Service Law, as amended, and Title 16, Chapter VIII, Parts 890.60 through 899, of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, as amended (collectively the "Cable Laws");

WHEREAS, the Town, executed a franchise agreement with Verizon New York, Inc. (the "Franchisee") on March 12, 2007, which was thereafter confirmed and made effective by the New York State Public Service Commission ("Commission") on April 20, 2007 for a term of fifteen (15) years (Case No.07-V-0321), and

WHEREAS, said franchise agreement expired on April 19, 2022; and

WHEREAS, Franchisee has submitted a proposed franchise renewal agreement (the "Franchise Renewal Agreement") to continue operating its system within the Town for a term of 5 (five) years; and

WHEREAS, The Town and Franchisee have mutually agreed to the terms of said Franchise Renewal Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Town has determined that the Franchisee is and has been in substantial compliance with all terms/provisions of its existing franchises and applicable law; and

WHEREAS, the Town has determined that Franchisee has the requisite legal, technical and financial capabilities to operate a Cable System within the Town and that Franchisee's proposals for renewal of the franchises meet the cable related needs of the Community; and

WHEREAS, a duly noticed Public Hearing, affording an opportunity for all those interested parties within the Town to be heard on the proposed Franchise Renewal Agreement was held before the Town on August 20, 2024.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Council determines that it is in the best interest of the public to award the Franchise Renewal Agreement to the Franchisee; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Council hereby authorizes the Town Supervisor to enter into the Franchise Renewal Agreement with Verizon New York, Inc. and to execute any other documents necessary to effectuate the granting of the franchise renewal on behalf of the Town of Orangetown.

RESOLVED, that upon the recommendation of the Town Attorney, the Supervisor is hereby authorized to execute a Payment in Lieu of Taxes Agreement ("PILOT"), between and among the Town of Orangetown, Instrumentation Laboratory Company, the South Orangetown Central School District, the County of Rockland and the County of Rockland Industrial Development Agency, relating to real property known as and located at 526 Route 303, Orangeburg, NY (Tax Map designation Section 70.19 Block 1 Lot 45), commencing with the 2025 tax assessment roll through and including the 2034 tax assessment roll as set forth more fully in the agreement.

9. AWARD MINI-BID / FRIENDLY FORD OF HAMILTON / TWO 2024 FORD F-150 LIGHTNING PRO ELECTRIC VEHICLES

RESOLVED, upon the recommendation of the Supervisor's Office and in accordance with NYS OGS Vehicle Marketplace Solicitation #23166 and Mini-Bid Award # 001-2024, the Town Board hereby awards the Mini-Bid for two (2) 2024 Ford F-150 Lightning Pro Electric Vehicles to Friendly Ford of Hamilton, NY, the lowest qualified bidder, in the amount of \$88,466.66, to be paid using grants funds with the overage charged to Account Nos: A.7110.200 (Parks) and G.8120.200 (DEME).

10. APPROVE / FUND OVERAGE / STATE AND MUNICIPAL (SAM) GRANT / WATER REFILLING STATIONS / JOSEPH B. CLARKE RAIL TRAIL

WHEREAS, the Town of Orangetown has been approved by the State of New York to receive a State and Municipal Facilities Program (SAM) grant to be administered by the Dormitory Authority of the State of New York (DASNY) for water refilling stations for the Joseph B. Clarke Rail Trail in the amount of \$50,000, subject to review and approval of DASNY and the submission of further documentation by the Town to DASNY; and,

WHEREAS, the Town Board hereby finds the purchase of water refilling stations for the Joseph B. Clarke Rail Trail and acceptance of the grant a Type II action under SEQRA which requires no further review with respect to SEQRA;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board agrees to accept the SAM grant from the State of New York, which is to be administered by DASNY, in the amount of \$50,000 towards the purchase of the water refilling stations for the Joseph B. Clarke Rail Trail; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Town Board agrees to fund the remainder of the cost and any overages, through the Parks Trust, for the water refilling stations, not to exceed \$20,000; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Supervisor or her designee is authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to accept and administer the grant for the water refilling stations for the Joseph B. Clarke Rail Trail in accordance with DASNY requirements, subject to review and approval of the Town Attorney's Office.
