Donald Brenner, Attorney for the applicant, and Jay Greenwell, Land Survey & Planner, explained and answer questions regarding this project.

Summary of Public Comments:

Vanessa Lapins, Don Gabel, Tom Shalvey, Henry Wemmer, Joy Macy, Michele Brisson, James McCaffery, Carolyn Hill, Elizabeth Harding, Nicole Ramirez, Michelle Fitzpatrick, Anna Ramirez, Thomas Rooney, & Ronald Harmon, Blauvelt; and Jacob Tannenbaum, Tappan; are opposed to this project. They believe this is too high-density and they are concerned about flooding, the wetlands & watersheds, the turtles, wildlife, increased in traffic, and the electrical grid. The Town Board should keep to the Comprehensive Plan and keep it open space.

Billy O, Blauvelt, opposes this project. Anyone with a vested interest should recuse themselves from voting. He accused the Town Board of greed.

Mary Ann Gavioli, Orangeburg, asked, if this Zone Change is approved, what happens to the abutting 49 acres, zoned R-80. The Town Board should look at this petition very carefully and preserve the nature of the area.

Wayne Gavioli, Orangeburg, if this zone change is allowed, the Town Board will be opening a pandora box and will not be able to close it. When the water company brought lawsuits, as outside counsel for the Town, he argued in the Supreme Court, Appellate Division and the Court of Appeals, there is no reason to change the zoning of this property and won.

Eileen Larkin, Palisades, believes R-40 would be more acceptable to the area with 7 - 8 homes. She suggested the Town Board sit-down with the neighbors.

Brian Harmon, Blauvelt, asked, what is the process for this project to be approved or denied.

WHEREAS, the Town Board hereby finds the purchase of shade structures for three Orangetown Parks and acceptance of the grant a Type II action under SEQRA which requires no further review with respect to SEQRA;
