**WHEREAS**; a coalition of Rockland County municipalities with like planning objectives has been formed to pool resources and create consistent mitigation strategies within Rockland County; and

WHEREAS, the coalition has completed a planning process that engages the public, assesses the risk and vulnerability to the impacts of natural hazards, develops a mitigation strategy consistent with a set of uniform goals and objectives, and creates a plan for implementing, evaluating and revising this strategy;

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Orangetown:

- Adopts in its entirely, the 2024 Rockland County Hazard Mitigation Plan Update (the "Plan") as the jurisdiction's Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan and resolves to execute the actions identified in the Plan that pertain to this jurisdiction.

- Will help to promote and support the mitigation successes of all participants in this Plan.
- Will incorporate mitigation planning as an integral component of government and partner operations.
